


## Partnership for Prescription Assistance Celebrates 10th Anniversary and New Website

This week the Partnership for Prescription Assistance (PPA) celebrates its 10th anniversary of helping connect uninsured or underinsured Americans to programs that provide prescription medicines for free or nearly free. Since its launch in 2005, PPA has connected nearly 9.5 million Americans to public and private assistance programs.

In order to provide patients and caregivers with faster, easier access to information for more than 475 public and private patient assistance programs, PPA recently launched a [redesigned website](#).


The modernized website has information on how uninsured patients can access health care coverage along with interactive content on how to improve health for patients of all ages. The new website also includes information on more than 100,000 free health care clinics throughout the United States.
